The last few weeks of any school year are extremely busy.

Last week we had two very important ceremonies at our school assembly. Mayor Bob Kirk presented our 2019 School Leaders with certificates of appreciation and discussed what leadership is. Mayor Kirk holds a ceremony each year at the Council Chambers where all school leaders are recognised for their work. Our school leaders were unable to attend this ceremony as they were at their school camp in Berry, so Mayor Bob came to us.

We also had a very special ceremony to open our school Peace Pole. This Peace Pole was an initiative between the Rotary Club of Goulburn and the Rotary Club of Canberra Burley Griffin. Our school is the 9th school in Australia to have their own Peace Pole. It is hoped by 2021 there will be 100 Peace Poles in 100 schools across Australia.

Our pole has the words 'May Peace Prevail on Earth' written in four languages - English, Japanese, Greek and Maori. We chose these countries as they have special significance to Goulburn and our school. We had some invited community members to recite these words in their language. Poppy and Indy Kershaw's grandmother (Yia-Yia) Mrs Andrea Fatouros spoke in Greek; Ella and Georgia Kiss's mother Kim Lowe spoke in Maori to represent New Zealand, while Ayaka Suzuki our schools music teacher and family friend of Sophie, Bow and Vincent Barton spoke in Japanese. Members of the Rotary Club of Goulburn and Mr Michael Raby from Canberra Rotary attended the ceremony. A wonderful afternoon tea was held in the library for the School Leaders, SRC executive and other student members.

This week our Year 5 and 6 students are having a wonderful time at Berry Sport and Recreational Camp. They are having a fun packed week, with many of the activities revolving around water. A huge thank you must go to Mrs Robinson and Mr Manning who have left their own families to accompany our students to camp. They will be on duty 24/7and they will be more exhausted than the children by Friday.

This Friday, 102 students from Kindergarten to Year 4 will attend the Lieder Theatre's production of the 13 Storey Treehouse. I know that it will be an amazing life theatre show.

Christmas can be a difficult time of the year and we are hoping that Goulburn East may be able to make a small difference to some children at Grenfell Public school. Aboriginal Student Group Symbol

Last year the students worked with Peter Swain and some parents to come up with ideas for an Aboriginal symbol that told the story of our Aboriginal Student Group. After the children drew some designs Monica and Jodie helped put all the ideas together and came up with three design ideas.

The students and their families voted for the design they liked the most. This is the design that was chosen. Last week we had guest artists, Sierra's mum Monica, and Summer and Zaha's dad Tony, come and help us paint the design on a big board.

Early this term Monica and Tony came and helped our Aboriginal Student Group, Toby, Chelsea, Sam, Sierra, Summer, Jarrah and Zaha paint the design on a big board which will be proudly hung in our playground.

The symbol has special meaning to our school. The red and blue circles are our school colours and represent our meeting place – Goulburn East Public School. The semi-circles are sitting marks around a campfire and represent the year levels at this school and also represent the Aboriginal students currently at our school.

The red, black and yellow lines connecting the meeting place to the outside circles are the colours of the Aboriginal flag and represent our story/song lines and us sharing and learning about our culture at school and at home.

The circles around the outside are our families and home. There is a connection between us, our home and school. The song lines around the outside show our connection to each other and the wider Aboriginal community.


The handprints are the handprints of the students who painted the symbol and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island students in the future will add their finger prints to form a border.
