
VOLUNTEERS IN THE CLASSROOM or CANTEEN



Reason for nomination over page

- Nominations can be made by an individual or organisation.
- Nominees must be Australian citizens and residing in or around the Goulburn Mulwaree area at the time of nomination.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be renominated in subsequent years
- Self-nominations will not be accepted
- Awards will not be granted posthumously
- The Award cannot be made to a current employee of Goulburn Mulwaree Council
- The Award cannot be made to a Councillor, State or Federal politician. Consideration of retired politicians and officers would be for work in addition to their official duties.
- A person cannot receive a second award in the same Awards category, but can be considered for recognition in a separate category in following years e.g. Young Citizen of the Year and then Citizen of the Year.
- The award must be for work, activities or an event performed or held within the Goulburn Mulwaree area.
- Regard will be given to a person's community activities in the year immediately

- as the "Australia Day Citizen of the Year" and "Australia Day Young Citizen of the Year". However, the Goulburn Australia Day Committee reserves the right to award
- The decision of the committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into relating to the decision.
- All nomination forms and material
- submitted remains the property of Council. - All nominees should be available to attend
- the presentation ceremony on Australia Day - All nominees and nominators should be aware that all aspects of their nomination, including reasons for nomination and their photos, and attendance at the Australia Day event, may be used for publicity purposes for Australia Day. - The Australia Day Committee, or
- Goulburn Mulwaree Council, reserves the right to not award an Australia Day award in a particular year, or to withdraw an award if further information or the recipient's conduct draws the Local Citizen of the Year Awards into disrepute.
