




#### **Quota Public Speaking**

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD HAS TO STAY AWAY FROM SCHOOL?



#### The school must be notified if your child will be away.

It is important to let the school know when your child will be away and why your child is absent. Parents can notify the school of their child's absence by:

- Submitting an absence through the School Bytes Parent Portal (preferred method)
- Ringing the school on the morning of each day's absence

Please **DO NOT** submit absences via email or Seesaw.

#### Extended absence due to travel or illness

If your child will be absent for a holiday of five days or more during the school term, an Application for Extended Leave (Travel) must be completed PRIOR to leave being taken for approval to be considered; otherwise, the absences will be marked as unjustified.

If your child visits a doctor due to illness, please request a Medical Certificate covering the date(s) of the absence(s). Extended absences due to illness may be eligible for an *Exemption from School* if a Doctor's Certificate is provided for the entire period.

## **Cooking Fritters**

Fritters

**Ingredients –** Group recipe <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup wholemeal flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup milk 1 egg <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup zucchini grated <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup carrot grated <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup grated cheese <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup corn kernals 1 spring onion

#### Equipment Large bowl Fork Measuring cups Electric frypan/frypan Wooden spoon Spatula Small bowl



#### Method

- 1. Wash hands.
- 2. Crack egg into small bowl and whisk with a fork. Make sure there is no shell!
- 3. In large mixing bowl, add flour, milk and egg. Mix until smooth.
- 4. Chop spring onions, grate carrot and zucchini.
- 5. Mix vegetables and cheese into batter mixture.
- 6. Spoon mixture into electric frypan/frypan to make 8cm pancake.
- 7. When the fritters form bubbles on the top, it is time to flip them over.
- 8. Cook for another 2 3 minutes or until brown. Transfer fritters to a plate.
- 9. Repeat steps 6 8 until all batter is used. Enjoy!

Please note that original documents will need to be sighted at the office, and 100 points of proof of address documents must be provided in accordance with the Residential Address Checklist which is available from the school office.

To finalise your child's enrolment, you will need to bring along:

- Your child's birth certificate
- Your child's immunization certificate (available from Medicare)
- Proof of address documents


